Thank you for contacting me about your concerns regarding Walker v. The United States Congress. As your Representative, I appreciate hearing from you on this topic and I apologize for the delay in my response.

Please rest assured, that I am well aware of the situation. As I understand it, Walker v. The United States Congress revolves around the calling of another constitutional convention under Article V of the United States Constitution. The plaintiff in the case claims that all fifty states have at one time or another in the last 216 years applied to Congress for a convention, and therefore that Congress is obligated by law to call one.
